- Only one of the following will satisfy the requirements for a degree: MATH 140, MATH 141, MATH 166 and MATH 168
- Only one of the following will satisfy the requirements for a degree: MATH 131, MATH 142, MATH 147, MATH 151 and MATH 171.
- Only one of the following will satisfy the requirements for a degree: STAT 201, STAT 301, STAT 302 or STAT 303.
- Students may have to complete College Algebra (MATH 1314) at their institution before taking MATH 1324 or 1325.
- Students may have to complete MATH 1324 at their institution before taking MATH 1325 at their institution.
- College Algebra is a transferable course but **will not** satisfy the Mathematics requirements in this degree plan.



- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term must have the required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester **before applying**.

### Additional Transfer Requirements

- *To be considered for admission applicants must:*
  - *Submit within the transfer application essay(s) articulating:*
    - What is your passion?
    - How did you get it?
    - What are your career goal(s)?
    - Why did you choose HMGT-Event, Tourism and Recreation Management?
    - How can an HMGT degree with a track in Event, Tourism and Recreation Management help you reach those goals?
  - *Title IX: All TAMU employees who become aware of discrimination, harassment (including sexual violence) and/or retaliation must report it regardless of how they become aware of the information*
- Letters of Recommendation
  - Letters are not required, but they can be submitted as part of your packet.
  - These will be uploaded to the Applicant Information System.
- Second-Choice Major Eligible
  - If you choose HMGT-ETM as your second choice, write a separate essay(s) answering the questions above. Please have your name and TAMU UIN as a header. Send a PDF copy of the essay to [AGLSAdvisingHub@ag.tamu.edu](mailto:AGLSAdvisingHub@ag.tamu.edu) with the email subject line of "HMGT-ETM Transfer – 2<sup>nd</sup> choice" as soon as you receive a TAMU UIN.
- The Department is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus.
- Hospitality, Hotel Management and Tourism is **NOT** a transitional major.
  - Transfer applicants are instructed **NOT** to accept transfer admission to our major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major to a different major.

### Additional Information

- Meeting with an HMGT Academic Advisor is strongly suggested prior to application.
- Repeated courses will also be used in the GPA calculation.
  - Example: If an applicant makes an F in ENGL 1301, then repeats ENGL 1301 and makes an A, the A and the F both will be used in the GPA calculation.
- A grade of 'D' is considered passing unless otherwise noted; however, a grade of 'D' negatively impacts the GPA.
